Hardware Requirements

You need a Macintosh or Macintosh+ with at least $512 \, \mathrm{K}$ of memory. A second disk drive, although not required, is recommended.

Loading

Insert the disk **Shadowgate** One into the internal disk drive on your computer. If you have two disk drives, insert **Shadowgate** Two into the external drive. If you do not have a second disk drive, you will be prompted by the computer when you need to swap disks. Turn on the computer. The program will load and begin automatically.

Saving Games

You should not save any games in progress to either Shadowgate One or Shadowgate Two. Both disks are quite full, and you will probably experience difficulties if you fill up what space is left with saved games. You should have a separate storage disk to use for saves.

Using a Hard Disk

It is possible to install the files from Shadowgate Two onto a hard disk. Simply drag the Shadowgate Two icon onto your hard disk. A folder will be created which contains the necessary files. Start your computer normally. When you see the desktop, insert Shadowgate One into the internal drive and double-click the Shadowgate icon. The game will run using the graphics and sound files from the hard disk. Although Shadowgate runs primarily in RAM, you may notice some increase in speed from this process.

NOTE: Shadowgate One is copy-protected, and as such, can not be copied or installed onto your hard disk. Shadowgate Two should be backed up and the original put away for safekeeping.

Macintosh Menus

In addition to the File menu described in the manual, the Macintosh version of Shadowgate uses the following menus:

It also allows access to the desk accessories installed in the System file.

Special

Clean Up Mess Up Straighten up the contents of a window. Mess up the contents of a window.

Use Clean Up if a contents window is too messy. Use Mess Up if you think it's too neat.

Font

Changes the font used for all text displayed.

You can use this to change the font to anything you want. The text will reformat to suit whatever font you choose.

FontSize

Changes the size of the current font. Only sizes which are in the system file will be displayed.
